El Toro Memorial Park to Hold 34th Annual Veterans Day Program

If Veterans hold a special place in your heart, please make plans to attend El Toro Memorial Park's 34th Annual Veterans Day Observance. The event will be held on Saturday, November 11th at 11:00 a.m. This is a wonderful opportunity to show our Veterans that their service and sacrifice is remembered, appreciated and honored!

We are excited to welcome Laguna Woods Mayor, Cynthia Conners as our keynote speaker. Mavor Conners served as an officer in the Armed Forces for 11 years. She entered active duty in early 1975, as a Lieutenant in the Women's Army Corps. As the Army more fully integrated women into the service, she became a transportation officer, and then a JAG attorney, serving as a prosecutor with the 2nd Infantry Division at Camp Casey, Korea. Stateside, she was stationed at Fort McClellan, Alabama; Oakland Army California; Fort Eustis, Base. Virginia; Fort Carson, Colorado; and

Ballet Folklorico Donaji is a local youth dance group that will perform a variety of traditional dances with performers ranging in age from as young as 4 to 21.

Angel of Hope Candlelight Service – Wed., December 6th at 7 pm

Every year on December 6th at 7 p.m., families gather at the Angel of Hope Statue at El Toro Memorial Park for the candlelight ceremony honoring the memory of the children they have lost.

Parents, relatives, and friends are invited to gather and lay white flowers and other tokens at the Angel's feet and, most importantly, speak their child's name. For many, this is the most profound moment of the evening. The program also includes

special guest speakers who share their experiences of loss, poetic readings, touchina and musical performances.

The event takes place rain or shine, so please dress appropriately for the weather. White flowers and candles will be provided. It is recommended that you bring a flashlight as lighting at night is limited in the park. Please bring your own lawn chair as seating is not provided.



Join Us for Wreaths Across America on Sat., Dec. 16th at 9 am

Across Wreaths America provides over 1.5 million wreaths worldwide to be placed on U.S. veteran graves during the holidays. Local groups register with Wreaths Across America to seek wreath sponsorships. The sponsorships cover the costs to produce the wreaths and can serve as fundraisers for local groups.

In 2017, a dedicated troop of American Heritage Girls were the first to sell wreaths for El Toro Memorial Park. Each year they lead a beautiful wreath ceremony at El Toro, and everyone is encouraged to place the wreaths that have been sponsored after the ceremony concludes.

At Santa Ana Cemetery, the Santa Ana Elks Lodge is also coordinating a ceremony.

Both programs will be held on Saturday, December 16th at 9:00 a.m. with the wreath placement to follow. Our goal is to secure enough wreath sponsorships to ensure that every Veteran's grave is honored on December 16th. But we need your help! We can't place wreaths unless wreaths are sponsored.

Wreaths cost \$17.00 each. Wreath placements cannot be assigned to specific gravesites and are placed randomly on graves. veteran Also. sponsoring a wreath does not guarantee you will be able to place a wreath. Most years there are not enough wreaths sponsored to cover everv veteran who is interred. When wreath placement begins, if you did not sponsor a wreath, please wait at least five minutes to allow those who did sponsor a wreath to have an opportunity to place at least one wreath. Wreaths are delivered directly to the cemetery prior to the wreath placement ceremonv on December 16th. The last day to sponsor a wreath is Nov. 28th.

Staff Attend California Association of Public Cemeteries (CAPC) Annual Education Seminar and Area Meeting in Sacramento

The California Association of Public Cemeteries is dedicated to promoting the development of Public Cemetery Districts and Public Cemetery governance through interactive communication, education and legislative advocacy. Every fall they hold an Annual Education Seminar to give members a chance to network and learn form one another's experiences.

This year's conference was held Oct. 6th-7th in Sacramento. Our District sent Santa Ana Cemetery Manager, Julio Amarillas and El Toro Memorial Park Cemetery Associate, Robert Hernandez to the conference. Presentations included: a discussion on Green Burials; Understanding the Brown Act; Best practices for Interment and Disinterment Forms; Interviewing and Hiring Do's & Don'ts; and the importance Standard of Operating Procedures and use of Checklists. The California Special Districts Association provided a legislative also update and there were breakout sessions where attendees could share common concerns and hear how other Districts deal with similar problems. CEMETERY VISITATION HOURS

Anaheim Cemetery and Santa Ana Cemetery are open for visitation, seven days a week, from 8 am to 5 pm.

El Toro Memorial Park will be open until 7 pm through Saturday, Nov. 4th. Starting on Sunday, Nov. 5th, El Toro will close at 5 pm.

> Cemetery Offices are open M-F 8 am to 5 pm All offices are closed on the weekends and on holidays.

Flower Removal and Holiday Schedule

Every Wednesday, groundskeepers remove and discard flowers and decorations throughout all three cemeteries. Families are encouraged to remove their flowers and/or decorations on Tuesday night. You can then place the flowers back on the space on Thursday morning. Please remember that the District policy only allows for two items to be placed on gravesites. This includes the in-ground flower vase and one other item. If gravesites exceed the number of allowed items, staff may remove and discard the excess items. Please do not leave items of great monetary or sentimental value on gravesites as the District cannot prevent theft.

Throughout the year, various holidays are recognized with extended periods between full park clean-ups. During these times, we do ask that you empty the vase and place fresh water in the container every four to five days to eliminate mosquito breeding sources, which can cause serious health issues. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

In honor of Halloween and Dia de los Muertos, flowers may be placed on Thursday, Oct. 19th and must be removed by Tuesday, Nov. 14th. Items for Thanksgiving, Christmas, Kwanzaa, and Hanukkah may be placed beginning Thursday, November 16th and must be removed by Tuesday, January 2, 2024. During these periods, light clean-up will still occur each Wednesday and only flowers that are obviously wilted will be removed.

Please be advised, during full park clean-ups everything on gravesites are discarded. Please be sure to remove items you do not want discarded before the cemetery closes on Tuesdays.
